## Today's Hymn Note: *Christ for the World We Sing*

Lyricist Samuel Wolcott said of this hymn:

The Young Men's Christian Association of Ohio met in one of our churches with their motto in evergreen letters over the pulpit: "Christ for the World, and the World for Christ." This suggested the hymn "Christ for the world we sing." It was on my way home from this service in 1869, walking alone through the streets, that I put together the four stanzas of the hymn.

Wolcott, a Congregationalist minister, preached in churches in New England and Midwest. He is believed to have turned to hymn writing at the age of 55, and this hymn was one of his first efforts. The prolific composer, opera conductor, and violinist, Felice de Giardini, wrote the tune, ITALIAN HYMN, which is also known as TRINITY or MOSCOW. The tune's name refers to the nationality of the composer.
